When a group of unelected people (members of the PCT) who are supposedly there to protect the interests of the local population where health is concerned, focus entirely on budgets and removing assets from the balance sheet (the Bartlet Hospital) and chanting the mantra of care in the community, which the rest of us know will not provide the

As there will be no statistics kept, which would identify whether people who have been sent home from our local acute hospital (Ipswich or any other), instead of via the Bartlet, have suffered any detrimental effects to their health or have met an earlier death than would have been the case, means that those taking these decisions will not be accountable for them in the future.
